FACT SHEET 2024

[The Military Officers Association of America \(MOAA\)](#) is the nation's largest and most influential association of military officers. It is an independent, nonprofit, politically nonpartisan organization.

[The Falcons Landing Chapter \(FLC\)](#) is one of more than 400-plus local organizations affiliated with National MOAA and is a member of the Virginia Council of Chapters. The Chapter is located at Falcons Landing, a Life Plan Community which is operated by the Air Force Retired Officers Community (AFROC). It is the only MOAA Chapter in Loudoun County. The Chapter is also a member of the [Virginia Council of Chapters, MOAA](#)

The mission of the Chapter is to provide programs to support: *those who are serving; those who have served; and those who have survived*, while placing special focus on community support.

Chapter membership is open to those who hold, or have ever held, a warrant or commission in any component of the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Space Force, Public Health Service, NOAA, and their surviving spouses.

As of March 31, 2024, there were 131 Premium Members and 81 Auxiliary Chapter Members for a total of 212 Chapter Members.

The most significant, ongoing program for the Chapter is the multifaceted local support to veterans and their families. The Chapter established the *Loudoun Veterans and Family Support (LVFS)* program in partnership with Community Lutheran Church of Sterling, providing financial and general support to Loudoun County Veterans needing assistance.

The Chapter strongly supports the [Loudoun County Community Veterans Engagement Board \(LCCVEB\)](#), whose purpose is promoting a healthy and enriched lifestyle for Loudoun County veterans and their family members through community outreach and advocacy on Loudoun County veterans' issues.

The Chapter sponsors the *Gathering*, a program of distinguished guest speakers for monthly presentations on current and past world and government affairs.

The Chapter has established a *Speakers' Bureau*. This initiative is in keeping with the chapter's goal of continuing to inform the American public about their military establishment. There are currently 16 topics and speakers available for presentation to the local community.

Four times a year the Chapter supports the *AdoptaPlatoon Soldier Support Effort®* dedicated to serving deployed United States Service Men and Women by providing ongoing care packages to improve quality of life and raising morale for those serving overseas in the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corp, Coast Guard and Special Forces.

The Chapter supports three *Junior ROTC* units in our area of responsibility: the Air Force JROTC unit at Chantilly High School in Fairfax, the Navy JROTC unit at Loudoun County High School in Leesburg, and the Army JROTC unit at South Lakes High School in Reston. The Chapter President and Director of JROTC Programs present scholarships to selected cadets at each school. In addition, the Lieutenant General John Pustay Scholarship is awarded to a selected cadet at Chantilly High School.

Memorial and Veterans Day Programs are presented each year at Falcons Landing.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT INFORMATION AND PRIORITIES

Periodically, MOAA will lobby Congress to take legislative action to preserve our retiree benefits. The probability of favorable legislative action is in direct proportion to the number of voters who register support. MOAA sometimes includes postcards and letters in its magazine (Military Officer) for us to sign and mail to our representatives (identified for us). The MOAA Newsletter may also include an online access to act. It is imperative that we do so. To access the MOAA Newsletter go to the MOAA website at www.moaa.org and select the News and Info tab, followed by selecting Newsletters.

The MOAA Newsletter “is an award-winning member-only e-newsletter subscription to provide information on topics most important to you. Whether you’re looking for updates on current legislative issues, want to know more about your military benefits, or just interested in the latest MOAA events, you can tailor your newsletter to align with your specific needs and interests.” It is included with your MOAA membership. Our Chapter periodically publishes Legislative Updates for all members and works with MOAA to recommend to members that they support MOAA legislative initiatives by contacting their legislators. MOAA staff and Chapter members meet with members of Congress annually. 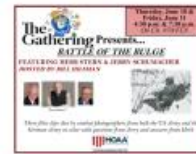

THE GATHERING: BEHIND THE HEADSTONES AT ARLINGTON

An inspiring presentation was given to the Gathering audience by Blane Amphor, a local historian, as he provided a number of stories, based on the names on headstones at Arlington National Cemetery, about some of the illustrious heroes and veterans of major events of history. It was certainly a topic of interest to residents of Falcons Landing, many of whom are eligible for burial at Arlington or other veterans' cemeteries. If you were not at our Gathering, you can see a replay of Blane's presentation about Arlington on Channel 970.

Blane opened his presentation with a story about William and Elizabeth Friedman, who were early code breakers serving in World War I, who also trained the military in the art of code breaking and later worked with the military after the war to develop mathematical methods and later develop code machines to collect and break codes as members of the newly formed National Security Authority (NSA).

Blane went on to discuss a number of other veterans who served in WWII, Korea and Vietnam including submarine captain (later Rear Admiral) Dick O'Kane, who received the Medal of Honor for operations against two enemy convoys in October 1944, and submarine captain (later Vice Admiral) Swede Morrison, who developed a rescue breathing device which was used to rescue submariners trapped in a sinking submarine and then served in both WWI and II. Blane also discussed a number of pilots, including Phillip Rasmussen, who was one of the pilots that responded to the attack during Pearl Harbor and managed to get airborne to engage enemy planes.

From there, he discussed Navy CAPT Winifred Collins, the second woman sworn into the US Navy in WWII, who later served as the Navy assistant chief of personnel for women from 1957-62. And Admiral

Grace Hopper who was one of the early developers of computer programs and helped introduce computers into general use in the military in those early days of computer science. She coined the word “bug” and developed the machine language COBOL. Grace Hopper was later recalled to duty in 1967, to help develop computer science capabilities in the military and is known as the “First Lady of Software.” Resident Bill Hilsman recalled her role in supporting Army development of computers, when she met with Army General Officers at Ft. Monmouth and later with signal NCOs to discuss computers and inspired both groups to employ computers. General Hilsman said that she was a driver in inspiring both groups.

Included in Blane’s presentation were stories about cartoonist Bill Mauldin, the author of Willie and Joe cartoons in WWII. Mauldin was a hero to soldiers and a great boost to morale. Blane added a mention of men who helped raise the flag on Iwo Jima, a salute to Glen Miller, who has a memorial marker at Arlington, and to Maureen O’Hara who, as a wife of a military veteran, is buried at Arlington.

GATHERING: IRAN-100 YEARS OF HISTORY

In January, residents gathered to hear the presentation on Iran, by fellow resident Jim Fontana. His presentation focused on our history with Iran over the past century. Jim's number of years in research and study on Iran culminated in a presentation to a Falcons Landing Great Decisions meeting, which formed the basic background for the presentation to this Gathering.

His presentation began with the end of WWI, the breakup of the Ottoman empire and with the development of the Muslim focused country that we know today as Iran—a culture that, as he explained, involves enforcing the strict morals of Islam in its society.

We can't cover the history of 100 years in this short review except to summarize the key events: the development of the Muslim Brotherhood, the initial leadership of the Shah of Iran and of U.S. involvement in the support to the Shah through involvement with the CIA. Then came the subsequent period with the fall of the Shah, the later assault and seizing of the U.S. embassy and our subsequent efforts to free the hostages and the development following the Shah (e.g., Khomeini).

Jim discussed the Iran-Iraqi War, Desert Shield and Desert Storm, the impact of 9-11 and the development of ISIS. Jim went on to discuss the Iranian efforts to develop a nuclear capability and our own efforts to slow the development. To review the history, be sure to watch the reprise of the presentation on channel 970.

As Jim began to end his discussion, he summarized with several points in his view concerning Iran today:

- Iran is a theocracy with the basic tenets of Islam and a fundamental view that Islam should dominate.

- Iran is a sponsor of terrorism.
- Iran supports the concept of “Death to the Israelis” and the destruction of Israel.
- Iran supports HAMAS and its goals.
- Today Iran is allied with Russia, China, and North Korea.
- Iran has begun to penetrate Latin America.
- Iran does not feel any significant threat from the West.
- Iran has no nuclear weapon but its technical development has taken it to about 90% and a short path to complete development of a nuclear capability if it decides to continue (open or covertly).

And today? Iran is a country that keeps a strong control over its people and embraces the governing principles of Islamic Law. There have been three violent protests over the past 15 years bordering on full blown uprisings, but the regime has responded brutally.

Iran has clear goals and is progressing well towards achieving them. It is the U.S. and the West which are struggling with the development of a clear strategy in which to contain Iran, according to Jim.

The presentation led to a number of questions and comments from our audience, who were deeply involved in Jim’s presentation. It was a strong end to the evening.

Our thanks to Jim Fontana for an excellent and thought-provoking presentation.
