





LEGISLATIVE REPORT INFORMATION AND PRIORITIES

Periodically, MOAA will lobby Congress to take legislative action to preserve our retiree benefits. The probability of favorable legislative action is in direct proportion to the number of voters who register support. MOAA sometimes includes postcards and letters in its magazine (Military Officer) for us to sign and mail to our representatives (identified for us). The MOAA Newsletter may also include an online access to act. It is imperative that we do so. To access the MOAA Newsletter go to the MOAA website at www.moaa.org and select the News and Info tab, followed by selecting Newsletters. The MOAA Newsletter "is an award-winning member-only e-newsletter subscription to provide information on topics most important to you. Whether you're looking for updates on current legislative issues, want to know more about your military benefits, or just interested in the latest MOAA events, you can tailor your newsletter to align with your specific needs and interests". It is included with your MOAA membership. If you are not registered with MOAA National for this, call the front desk (800) 234-6622, and you'll be guided on how to receive the newsletter on a desired schedule. Our Chapter publishes a monthly Legislative Update for all members and works with MOAA to recommend to members that they support MOAA legislative initiatives by contacting their legislators. MOAA staff and Chapter members meet with members of Congress annually. ACTION IN THE VIRGINIA LEGISLATURE ON EXEMPTING MILITARY RETIRED PAY FROM STATE INCOME TAX

HB 1128 establishes an income tax subtraction for up to \$20,000 of military benefits in taxable year 2022, up to \$30,000 in taxable year 2023, and up to \$40,000 in taxable year 2024 and each year thereafter. The bill defines military benefits to include military retirement income and benefits paid to the surviving spouse of a veteran. The bill contains an emergency clause. Bill has passed through the full house.

The companion senate boll, SB 586, provides an individual income tax subtraction for up to \$5,000 of military benefits in Taxable Year 2022, up to \$10,000 in Taxable Year 2023, up to \$15,000 in Taxable Year 2024, and up to \$20,000 in Taxable Year 2025 and each taxable year thereafter. The subtraction would be limited to recipients of such military benefits that are age 60 or older.

VCOC is asking MOAA membership to write Virginia legislators working this issue, specifically to lower eligible age in senate bill to 50.

MOAA PRESIDENT SOUNDS WARNING ON BENEFIT CUTS IN 'THE HILL' COMMENTARY



Just months after the end of the war in Afghanistan, and despite the massive buildup of forces in Europe, signs point to pressure on lawmakers to cash in some of the "peace dividend" at the expense of servicemembers, veterans, and their families and survivors. Instead of appreciation for the uniformed services community, such talk is "creating a much different, unsettling message," wrote Lt. Gen. Dana T. Atkins, USAF (Ret), MOAA's president and CEO, in a Feb. 9 commentary published by The Hill.

That message: "Thank you for your service and sacrifice, especially after two decades of war, but we need to cut your pay and benefits to modernize." Atkins addresses the "false choice between bullets and benefits" offered in some corners to justify increasing materiel budgets while leaving personnel accounts flat ... or worse. While this narrative poses a threat to the benefits earned through service, it's not a new fight, Atkins points out, highlighting budget-driven moves made in the last decade such as:

- The "pay gap" from 2014 to 2016, which shortchanged servicemembers and will cause ripple effects in retirement compensation for decades.
- Increases to TRICARE pharmacy costs and program fees outpacing retiree cost-of-living adjustments.
- The Blended Retirement System, which will reduce the value of a 20-year military career and cost DoD less money, with
 unclear results beyond readiness issues, as "mid-career service members consider leaving early and taking their wealth
 of experience out the door with them," Atkins wrote.

Only by engaging on these efforts to lessen benefits now will the uniformed services community avoid similar actions in coming years, especially in the face of inflationary pressures and other fiscal threats. "Our economy may fluctuate," Atkins wrote, "but our resolve on behalf of service members cannot." MOAA will mobilize this spring for its annual advocacy campaign, with an eye toward protecting military pay along with other critical legislative objectives. 
